

20-187 Resolved to donate \$25.00 to the Children's Wish Campaign. All in favour, Motion Carried.


BLOOM – ELECTED OFFICIAL WEBINAR SERIES

Councillor Stacey indicated that he will coordinate and attend the Annual Trunk or Treat Event on October 25, 2020.




The Town Clerk indicated that the Town needs to purchase a load of washed stone and that the office has received three quotes.

20 – 191 Resolved to purchase a tandem load of washed stone for the Golden Age Club at \$300.00 from TR Excavating Ltd. All in Favour. Motion Carried.

Mayor Pike indicated that Council is pleased to have Edwards and Associates Ltd as Prime Consultant on the Laurentian Estates Trunk Road project.

Discussion took place on the Pollux Phase II Water and Sewer Project progress. The Town Clerk was directed to contact the Engineering Company and the Contractor for this project and request a report on the status of the project, an





estimated completion date and to express Councils concern about the lack of communication regarding this project.

Councillor Lundrigan requested a Recreation Committee meeting within the next few weeks.

Councillor Stacey requested an updated listing of Committee Memberships.

Council discussed the possibility of placing a trail at the bottom of Iron Springs Road connecting across to Director Drive. It was suggested that Council contact CFI and ask that they install a culvert in this area to facilitate this trail.

Deputy Mayor Walsh opened discussion on the tour at CFI mine site that took place on October 19, 2020. The Town Clerk was directed to review the original agreement with CFI to identify the locations to be activated. Mayor Pike suggested that we send a letter to CFI indicating that Council is opposed to the next suggested open pit site and that CFI research other areas for production. Deputy Mayor Walsh suggested that Council set up a meeting with the Department of Industry, Energy and Technology to voice Councils concerns.
