ENGINEERING UPDATE - EDWARDS & ASSOCIATES LTD.

The Town Manager stated that she met with Ryan Billard from Edwards & Associates Ltd. to discuss ongoing projects.

<u>Pike's Drive</u> – The Town Manager stated that Ryan is hopeful that Wally Drake's Construction would be starting this project in the next few weeks.

<u>Water Intake Project</u> – The Town Manager stated that Ryan was hoping that the Water Intake Project would be out to tender by now. He is reviewing all documents and making suggestions for changes to the project scope. He also stated that he is hoping to have everything approved for the end of July, 2025 and the tender awarded by September 2025.

<u>St. Lawrence Fire Hall</u> – The Town Manager stated that she requested Ryan to complete a quote for asphalt replacement of the front section facing Water Street West at the Fire Hall.



<u>Seniors' Complex</u> – The Town Manager stated that she has requested Edwards & Associates Ltd. to complete the survey for the land that is planned to be conveyed to Cusick's Contracting for the Seniors' Housing Development on Marion Drive. The Town Manager also stated that she requested Ryan to outline the sewer upgrades that will need to be completed for this development and to provide a quote.

<u>Booster Pump, Pollux Crescent</u> – The Town Manager stated that she has requested Edwards & Associates Ltd. to review the potential for a Booster Pumping Station for the Pollux Crescent area.

<u>Culverts along Fairview Avenue</u> – The Town Manager stated that there are a few culverts along Fairview Avenue that seem to be deteriorating and she has asked Edwards & Associates to review their condition.

<u>Herring Cove – Water Street East</u> -The Town Manager stated that she has asked Edwards & Associates to inspect and evaluate the erosion of rock along the embankment on Water Street East.

CORRESPONDENCE FOR INFORMATIONAL PURPOSES

MANAGER'S REPORT – JUNE 17, 2025

The Town Manager stated that the Green Team has chosen the applicant for the Team Lead and Gary Brazil has accepted the position. She also stated that we are currently waiting for the Green Team to pick their other member, and then she will fill the remaining SSEP position.

The Town Manager stated that the Town is still accepting applications for the Job Creation Project for both the Tidy Town and Swimming Pool positions.

The Town Manager updated those in attendance on the status of the St. Lawrence Swimming Pool. Public Works employees have completed a lot of work in the last few days to get the pool ready for the season. She also stated that she is waiting on Pool Services NL to be on site to complete further repairs and install the liner.



The expenses for the pool have increased as the scope of the project changed once the original liner was removed. She suggested a Special Assistance Grant can be applied for at a cost share of 60/40%, with the municipal share at 40%.

GENERAL DISCUSSION

Councillor Lundrigan asked about the potholes around Town. The Town Manager stated that we have a paving program in place that will happen when the weather permits.

Councillor Lundrigan also asked about the demolition of homes around Town. He asked if there was any funding available that homeowners can apply for, or if it was at the owner's expense. The Town Manager stated that it would be the homeowner's expense unless the Town had a special events project. The Town Manager stated that there are many dilapidated homes within the Town.

Councillor Dupré asked if there was a timeframe for a response from NL Health Services regarding the letter submitted from the Town.

Councillor Doyle asked for the status of the Potable Water Dispensing Unit as it is out of order. The Town Manager stated that the parts are ordered, and we are awaiting for a delivery date.



Councillor Doyle also mentioned the safety hazard at the intersection of Riverside Drive and Route 220. There is no paint on the pavement to indicate lanes, some drivers are using the intersection as a three (3) lane roadway and this may cause the area to be unsafe. A suggestion for a crosswalk and painted lines in the area was brought forward.

Councillor Doyle also asked about reducing the speed limit from 50 to 40 on the Highway on Route 220 in the School Zone.

Mayor Pittman stated that he received an invitation from Ocean Choice International to attend their celebration celebrating 25 Years. The event is taking place at The Rooms in St. John's. He stated that he would check his schedule.
