SKILLS PASS NL


The Manager advised that she participated in a demo this morning with Skills Pass NL. She noted that any training you need to do, can eventually be done on the Skills NL site free of charge.



Council agreed to sign the proclamation declaring April 21 – 27, 2019 as National Organ and Tissue Donor Awareness Week.


MUNICIPAL SYMPOSIUM – MAY 2 – 4, GANDER NL



Discussion took place and the following are the priorities for the Town of St. Lawrence:


- Culvert – Route 220


SCHOOL BREAKFAST PROGRAM – APRIL 10, 2019
